Grade Names: Our grades will coincide with their Hebrew Alphabet equivalent (see below for our "Class Name Conversion" table) thus supporting some very basic Jewish skills.

Clarity of goals: (a) "HJC's Student/Parent Kavod (respect) Covenant" aims for a clearer sense of a caring, respectful, student community culture by engaging students in promoting Jewish values for themselves and each other. (b) The updated Shabbat attendance section highlights how we hope to achieve some of our communal goals of prayer, participation and learning. (c) Hebrew language Chug (meeting Thursdays) is especially geared for students who need help accessing language that leads to a richer understanding of, and connection to their Jewish identity and heritage. Those who took advantage of this last year gained a deeper enthusiasm for Hebrew language and ended the year without the need for additional Hebrew help.

Finally, this year, after hearing many parent talk about their interest in delving deeper into their own learning experiences we would like to encourage you to find at least one new workshop, holiday experience, Family program, or Religious School class to sit in and have your own new, nourishing, learning experience this year!

SHABBATONIM at the HJC Religious School

Shabbatonim mark milestones in each child's growth and knowledge in prayer and worship. It is an opportunity for children to show their parents and the congregation that they are evolving as young participants and leaders of the Jewish people. Last year, without fail these *Shabbatonim* were rewarding for parents, students, teachers and the larger community. Class meals are a great time to catch up with old friends and make new ones for both parents and children. We always include opening and closing blessing rituals to heighten our enjoyment and awareness of these special moments.

Students' participation in the *Shabbaton* and *Oneg Shabbat* is covered by your registration and enrollment fees. Fees for parents and other guests will be determined by the catering cost. Parents are invited to bring Kosher wine to enjoy at each *Shabbaton*.

K/GAN, 1st/Alef and 2nd/Bet Classes will participate in one *Shabbat* morning *Shindig*, followed by an *Oneg Shabbat*, sponsored by the classes.

4s-2nd Family Service: Friday, November 18th, 2012
5:00pm Service - 5:30pm Dinner

3rd/ Gimel Class will celebrate their Consecration, each student will receive their own *Siddur* at a special Friday night service and dinner just before the *Shavuot* holiday in Spring. This is always a very moving experience for both parent and child.

4th/Daled and 5th/Hey Classes begin their *Shabbaton* with a traditional family Shabbat dinner Friday evening with the class leading our congregational Friday night service.

6th/ VAV Class will conduct the entire Shabbat morning service for their parents and Junior Congregation participants. Students learn *Trop* (ancient notes that indicate chanting) to read from the Torah at the service. The Torah portion will then be discussed and debated by parents, grandparents and students. After services there will be a luncheon.

SHABBAT ATTENDANCE

WHY DOES HJC HAVE A SHABBAT ATTENDANCE COMPONENT?

Junior Congregation Services and Nitzanim on Shabbat and Holiday mornings are an integral part of your child's Jewish Education. There is nothing like immersing oneself in the prayer services and rituals to truly be prepared to join the congregation as a Jewishly literate leader or participant.

WHAT DOES HJC FEEL IS THE MINIMUM AMOUNT OF SHABBAT IMMERSIVE LEARNING ACCORDING TO AGE?

<p>Nitzanin</p> <p>K/Gan 2nd /Bet</p>	<p>Students should attend at least eight (8) Shabbat morning Nitzanim services to become more familiar with Shabbat prayers and to enjoy a fun, peer-community Shabbat atmosphere.</p>
<p>Junior Congregation</p> <p>3rd / Gimel 5th / Hey (see 6th - 7th grade information below)</p>	<p>Students should attend at least (10) Junior Congregation Services during the school year.</p>
<p>Jr. Cong. 6th / Vav</p>	<p>Students should attend at least (10) Junior Congregation Services during the school year.</p>
<p>6th / Vav Post Workshop</p>	<p>After the Bar/Bat Mitzvah Workshops, the students may choose to attend Shabbat services in the main sanctuary rather than in Junior Congregation. If the students choose to do this, up to five (5) attendances in the main sanctuary will count toward BOTH their 6th grade/Vav attendance, as well as the Bar/Bat Mitzvah year requirement. In addition, up to three (3) Friday Nights (post workshop) may be counted toward the requirement.</p>
<p>7th Grade Bar/Bat Mitzvah Year</p>	<p>Students in 7th Grade, as part of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah year requirement, must attend at least ten (10) Saturday morning services in the main sanctuary AND six (6) Friday night services. Attendances during the second half of the 6th Grade year may be counted toward this requirement (see above).</p> <p>Note: All pre-Bar/Bat Mitzvah requirements must be completed three months prior to their Bar/Bat Mitzvah date.</p>

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

High Holidays: HJC High Holy Day services (Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur) may be counted for a maximum of one (1) Shabbat attendance.

Friday Nights: For Students in **Kindergarten through 5th Grade**, as well as **6th Grade** (before the Bar/Bat Mitzvah workshops), attendance at two (2) Friday night services will count as one (1) Shabbat morning service. This may be used only once in a school year.

Bar/Bat Mitzvah Attendance:

At HJC: For **Kindergarten through 5th Grade**, as well as **6th Grade** (before the Bar/Bat Mitzvah workshops), please go to either Nitzanim or Junior Congregation to have your card turned and then return to the main sanctuary. Students in **7th Grade** should follow the normal attendance procedure.

At another CONSERVATIVE synagogue: Students may receive credit for a maximum of two (2) attendances at a Conservative Bar or Bat Mitzvah service at another synagogue. Parents should notify Maxine of attendance. We recognize the value in attending all synagogue services, for educational purposes we feel that only other Conservative services will closely resemble our educational goals, and even then, they might not exactly mirror our goals, this is why we have set a limit on credit.

HOW ATTENDANCE IS TAKEN

Since writing is not permitted on Shabbat, we turn index cards with the student's name on it to note attendance (or in cases where there are consecutive attendance dates paperclips note double attendance). For details on where you can find index cards etc. please see the next page.

Please note: Parents should also keep track at home, in case there is a discrepancy, so that we can reconcile the information.

Saturday morning	Nitzanim & Junior Congregation The leader (or participants) turn student's index cards in the card file located in a cabinet in the library and Junior Congregation card file in the podium of the Lief Chapel.
	Bar/Bat Mitzvah Requirement (7th & second half 6th Grades) There is an index card file located in the podium on the floor level of the Main Sanctuary . <u>Students turn cards when services are over.</u>
Friday Night	Nitzanim (Pre K, Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd Grades) Please contact Maxine to let her know which night your child(ren) attended.
	Junior Congregation (3 rd – 6 th Grades) Index cards are located in the podium of the Lief Chapel. There are paper clips in the box. <u>When services are over, the student should find their card and place a paper clip on it.</u> Note: This is the same file box used Saturday.
	7 th Grade There is a special index card file for 7 th Grade that is located in the podium of the Lief Chapel. <u>Students should turn their own cards when services are over.</u>

SCHOOL POLICIES

KAVOD/RESPECTFUL ATTIRE and BEHAVIOR

The notion of participating in HJC community learning and prayer with *kavod/respect* is an integral type of experience we hope to cultivate for your family.

All students, parents and teachers should listen to one another and respect each other's opinions and point of views. Wearing an appropriate head-covering when participating in Religious School and other Jewish ritual experiences at HJC is another way our community shows respect for our community. Please, help us to create an environment of beauty that promotes *kavod/respect* for ourselves, our community and spiritual expression. Cultural and religious practices and customs can be difficult to discern, if you are uncertain about a particular practice or attire feel free to ask us about it and we would be happy to clarify, email Maxine Fisher at mfisher@hjcny.org, with your particular or general questions regarding appropriate, respectful attire.

TZEDAKAH

The mitzvah of *Tzedakah*, the responsibility of giving to those in need, is a basic value of Judaism. We want to instill in our students a sensitivity to the needs of others and a willingness to be generous in offering assistance. Therefore we collect *Tzedakah* money and stories in class and encourage every child to participate. Please check that your child is prepared to share a story of how they participated in *Tzedakah* in the past week or an affordable donation to support the class cause.

KASHRUT

HJC is a *kosher* facility, any snacks that families want to share need to be purchased from a *kosher* bakery (Stop N Shop and Walbaums are two such locations). If you have questions about certain items please feel free to contact mfisher@hjcny.org.

FAMILY-TEACHER CONFERENCES and PROGRESS REPORTS

Our doors are always open at HJC, we believe a successful Religious School program is inviting and exciting for students and their families. You will be receiving weekly updates from teachers. We encourage families to read these updates not only to keep up-to-date on events and learning at HJC, but as an opportunity to spark conversations at home. If something inspiring or funny comes out of these conversations please send in a line about it and we'll post it in our monthly Religious School updates.

Teachers and Families gain from parents in-school participation, feel free to inform us about talents and skills that you would like to share with us. We will be inviting parents and families to school-wide events, as well as special class events. We look forward to seeing you there, enriching and exciting the classroom with your presence and participation.

In the event that issues arise during the year, teachers will first try and address the issue with students one-on-one. Should the teacher, student and/or the Director feel that engaging the family in the process will be most beneficial teachers will set up a call with you. While there will be a mid-year Parent-Teacher conference, please do not wait until this time to share an important issue or concern with teachers or the Director. Your child's teacher will let you know if email or phone calls are the best way to reach them. The Director is also accessible during office hours, via email or by setting up a phone meeting to discuss any issues you feel are of a more delicate nature.

Student progress reports will be shared twice a year, once in December/January and once in May/June.

HONORING MENCHKEIT and MORE

AKIBA AWARDS

The Religious Director of each religious school in the METNY region selects one 6th grade student for an Akiba Award. Criteria include working towards a "personal best" in Judaic Studies, doing community service/*tikkun olam*, and serving as a synagogue student role model.

JUDAIC SCHOLARS

The Director awards Judaic Scholars certificates to students who exhibit respect and enthusiasm for Jewish learning, themselves and their community as well as being active participants in Nitzanim and Junior Congregation.

KETER TORAH HONOR SOCIETY

The Keter Torah Honor Society recognizes students who excel in Judaic Studies and exhibit the highest levels of personal behavior and commitment in their congregational religious schools. The special distinction is for students in the graduating class of their schools who have earned at least four Judaic Scholar Awards during five school years. Students receive a certificate and are inducted into the Keter Torah Honor Society at an annual public ceremony with families, principals and rabbis in attendance.

CLASS PARENTS

Our school is a partnership between the synagogue and the home, between the parents, students and our school's educators. Please volunteer to be a class parent. Class parents are an integral link to the thoughts and hopes of the families in each class. Class parents also assist with shopping and set-up for Shabbat meals and the phone chain for inclement weather. DROP-OFF and PICK-UP SAFETY GUIDELINES

In order to ensure the safety of all of our children, please take these very important rules to heart:

- 1.) All pick-ups are from the rear of the building. If you do not wish to wait in the pick-up line, please come into the building to escort your child to your car.
- 2.) For safety purposes please enter and exit cars from the driver's side only. We consider it unsafe for a child to walk in front of cars to get into the passenger side. If you do not have a rear door please exit the car to allow children to enter safely through the driver's door.
- 3.) When lining up from Leslie Lane, please pull as far to the left as possible in order to leave a free lane for those wishing to park.
- 4.) For the sake of our children's safety, if you need to pick your child up before dismissal, please send in a note to the teacher and sign your child out in the book located in the Religious School Office.
- 5.) School Safety Policy: No child may leave school without a parent.
